
2. Ultra Course View

3. Manage your notification

Are you getting too many or too little notifications? In your <u>Activity Stream</u>, click on the *Notification Settings* icon located in the top-right hand corner. You can then choose your stream, email and push notifications. You can also access these settings from your *Profile* page.





Stream Notifications

Notifications for due dates, grades, and feedback always appear in your stream. You can control what other activity appears in your stream.

Email Notifications

Choose how often you want to receive emails for activities.

- Email me right away: receive individual notifications for each activity you choose from the list.
- Email me once a day: all notifications are collected and emailed to you once a day at 6.30am.

Under *Notify me by email about these activities,* select which notifications you want to receive, such as new grades, new content added, and new messages. Clear all the checkboxes if you don't want to receive emails about the activities in the list.

Push Notifications


These settings allow you to choose what notifications to receive via the mobile app.

4. Learn how to download files in alternative formats



MyAberdeen provides functionality that creates alternative files that are easier to use by all students. Alternative files include ePub, electronic braille, audio, HTML, and tagged PDF. Don't stick to just one format! Use as many formats as you want. For example, if the content isn't in your first language, you could follow along in the ePub as you listen to the audio file.

To download alternative formats simply click on the drop-down menu next to any of your course documents and select *Alternative formats*. Then, select the format or formats that best suit your learning needs, and click *Download*. Sometimes you may get the message: 'The alternative formats for this file have been disabled'. In these instances, you tutor has disabled the alternative formats because of copyright restrictions. If you do need alternative

formats due to a disclosed disability, contact your tutor immediately.

- Install the *Blackboard app* on your mobile device.
- Open the app and search for the full name of your school.
- Log in with your IT username and password.
